Doğuş University Faculty of Art and Design faculty member Prof. Dr. Bengi Bugay is of the opinion that such trousers are designed for more consumption. Bugay, a stage decor and costume designer, stated the following:



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"We disseminate whatever the system gives us. Dirty trousers with 'incontinence' appearance; These are all things aimed at selling more under the name of fashion.

Clothing for more consumption is produced as fashion. The capitalist system launches new products every year. He does these to ensure more consumption. This even affects us from time to time. We are reading the news that the jeans, which were introduced at Milan Fashion Week last year and released recently, giving the appearance of urinary incontinence in the crotch area, were sold for 608 dollars (approximately 20 thousand TL) and had many buyers. There are two noteworthy points in this incident. The first is that, especially in the capitalist system where individualism is celebrated, differences are highlighted and the perspective of "the more different you are, the more independent you are" is promoted. In individualistic Western societies, it is assumed that "human beings" have a nature that is different from others, superior to them, and that prioritizes not the goodness and well-being of the community but the realization of individual interests and anale at all coete Fenerially in recent years



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goals at all costs. Especially in recent years, we see that these differences are highlighted through ethnic and sexual identities. Today, fashion operates according to the rules determined by capitalist productionconsumption relations, and in this process, various myths are produced within fashion to direct individuals to consume more in order to be different. This leads to an ironic result in people who think that they can only be individuals if they appear and are "different" from others within the social system, because, for example, in a short time, dozens of people wearing urine-stained trousers on a street do not actually differentiate, on the contrary, they become uniform.

Secondly, and more importantly, societies' perception of aesthetics and beauty is shaped according to the values fed by the socioeconomic structure of the age they live in. It is often assumed that changes in cultural values determine consumers' purchasing intentions and preferences in clothing. However, the important point here is that a cultural value system is deliberately changed or corrupted by manipulating people's preferences and tastes through fashion. In other words, changes in cultural value systems do not lead to such a change in "likes" and "preferences", on the contrary, clothes, accessories, hairstyles, everything that can be included in the scope of fashion, which are presented as if they were a preference, are actually imposed, to make society adopt a certain social system and its values. It is deliberately put on the market to make people take it for granted. Therefore, in this latest example of

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granted. Therefore, in this latest example of urine-soaked trousers, a product with connotations of "bad", "dirty" and "nauseous" are adjectives assigned to humanity; It is possible to say that it is an effort to build a system in which evil and filth are deemed worthy of humanity, rather than good, beauty and comfort. In other words, both the designer and the producer deliberately manipulate the taste and taste of the consumer, stripping people of all the values that make them human and turning them into pawns of capitalism.

As a result, fashion, as a social phenomenon, makes everyone similar to each other with the promise of providing identities different from the "majority", creates false differences by popularizing the sameness produced by the capital owners, and makes individuals believe an incredible lie with the propaganda of difference, uniqueness, uniqueness and innovation. Thus, identities and values are reproduced through urine-stained trousers.

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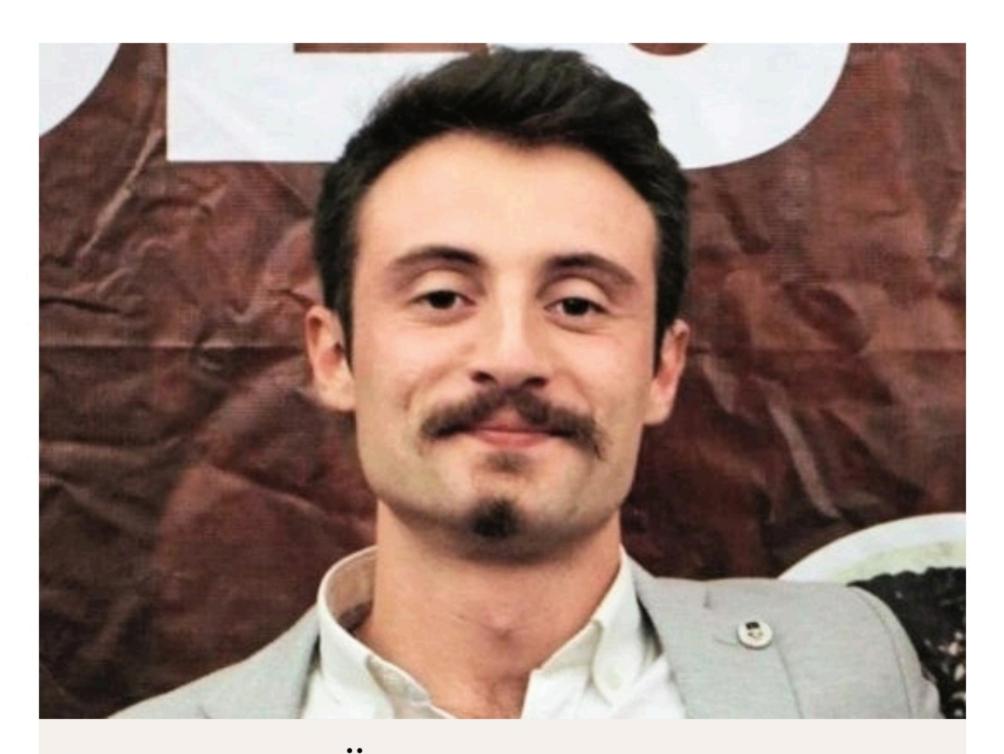
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Why do they resort to such a thing?
